




The 2022-2023 Program Year was one marked with growth, celebration, deepening partnerships, and strengthening our impact. By design, our programs have increased the frequency of attendance, so that we can make a more sustainable and long-term impact on the lives of our students. Our adult programs have

grown to provide parents with educational resources as well as English as a Second Language classes. Our team continues to adapt to meet our student, family, and community needs with grace and fortitude, and I am grateful to work alongside such an amazing group of dedicated individuals.

Through the generosity of our capital campaign donors, we were able to fully pay off our mortgage for our Avondale facility. Renovations have continued into 2023, and our site is now certified as a comfort care shelter to temporarily house displaced families during extreme weather events and flooding. The Garage Body Shop gymnasium as well as our "Diseño y Creatividad" Makerspace Art studio both opened in the Summer of 2023, and we are excited to watch these two new programs develop.

Stronger partnerships with local nonprofits, volunteers, funders, and municipalities have allowed our services to both increase and widen, as you will see through our transformation data as well as in the stories and photographs throughout this Annual Report. Our students, while still recovering from the effects of a global pandemic, are strengthening their minds, bodies, skills, values, and endurance. Our team is grateful for the opportunity to work with some of the most amazing young people in our community, and we are grateful to all of you who partner and invest in our mission. TUTORING

Students have access to one-on-one tutor support with general homework help, tutoring, and English language development. Many students utilize the Garage's computers and internet access to do research for school, apply to colleges and employment opportunities, and work on homework assignments. Middle school students can also connect with high school and Garage alumni who act as peer tutors and role models.



STEAM: ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION FOCUS

Agriculture and horticulture are important parts of our Southern Chester County community. Over the years, The Garage has been blessed to work with many of our local agriculture and horticulture companies, organizations, nonprofits, and businesses. Through a partnership with The Stroud Research Institute, students conducted surveys with local residents about chronic flooding and witnessed first-hand how environment policies affect our community. Workshops led by Mount Cuba have given our students a glimpse at the science behind conservation efforts as well as the joy of being in nature. On-site visits to local mushroom farms like To-Jo and South Mill have given our students the perspective that working in the mushroom industry is more than picking and packing — it

also requires skilled horticulturalists, accountants, marketers, logistics, human resources, and more. Garage students have also volunteered at Luther House by helping maintain their resident gardens.

We want to thank our partners for their forward-thinking vision, expertise in their fields, and passion for sharing their knowledge with the young people in our community. Their generous donations of resources and time, their hospitality and willingness to teach our students, and their desire to help connect with all members of our community not only make Garage students feel more a part of their community, but also make our communities, industries, and environment better for everyone.

GARAGE HONOR ROLL

This year, The Garage created a new academic incentive called the Garage Honor Roll. We want to incentivize students to strive for long-term success while also recognizing and rewarding students for their own self-motivation and desire for excellence. A student's quarter grades in their math, English, science, and social studies courses must be above a 3.0 GPA for them to qualify for the Garage Honor Roll. Any student on Honor Roll can choose to forgo homework hour to opt for some of the other Garage programs, such as The Garage Body Shop gym or the Marker's Space studio. We reward students who are self-motivated and organized enough to complete their homework by allowing them to make choices that will benefit their mental and physical health and creativity. In addition, any Garage student on Honor Roll is invited on one of our four quarterly field trips that occur throughout the school year.

PEER LEADERSHIP TEAM

Peer leadership opportunities are a great opportunity for older Garage students to build confidence, take on greater responsibility, and gain leadership experience that is not often given to school-aged students. For many high school students, leadership experience can be the stand-out characteristic that sets them apart from their peers when applying to colleges, scholarships, and jobs. The peer leadership team is meant to be mutually beneficial, impacting our students academically and socially while also benefiting the peer leader. Their perspective and insight is incredibly valuable in mentoring, tutoring, and connecting with younger students. Younger students often have an easier time connecting with a peer tutor because the peer tutor is able to relate to that student directly. In the long term, we would love to see middle school students become peer leaders themselves.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: JADAN FORREN

I first heard about the Garage Youth Center through one of my college advisors at West Chester University. I began volunteering at the Youth Center in order to complete a service learning component to one of my classes, but I plan to continue volunteering this following school year. I have had the wonderful opportunity to work with several ELL students at the Garage, and it has been a truly rewarding experience to watch these students work so hard. One of the students that I have worked with a lot is Cristina. Cristina is in high school and has shown me what true perseverance looks like. When I first met her she was shy and reserved, unsure about this random tutor



who spoke broken Spanish. But as time went on and I helped her understand her homework, she began to open up a bit more. I have only been at the Garage for a little over 2 months, but in that time I have seen Cristina become more confident in her English writing and reading skills, and more excited to learn new things. I am excited to see where life takes this wonderful student, and am very appreciative of all the Garage does for students in need of additional support.

NUTRITION KITCHEN

The Garage provides a nutritious lunch or dinner at each in-person session. These meals not only nourish our students physically, they also provide fuel and focus for the day's activities. We work with many partners, including local restaurants, The Chester County Food Bank, Kennett Consolidated School District, Avon Grove School District, Whole Foods, and surrounding grocery stores, to provide food and supplies to our students regularly. In addition, students may "earn" points for engaging in programs, completing homework, serving the community, etc., which they can then use to "purchase" additional specialty snacks.



In late 2021, Tracy Daly reached out to The Garage with an opportunity: her family had recently installed a Free Little Pantry (FLP) in Kennett Square, and they were interested in expanding their efforts to other communities. Tracy, along with her daughter Sara and her husband Mike, had recently joined the Free Little Pantry Movement. This movement partners with local food banks and community members to provide a "No questions asked. Give what you can. Take what you need." model of emergency food assistance for community members.

"Sharing food, whether at a meal or through the pantry, brings people together," Daly says. "Our Daly family traditions and events are always centered around food. With the Little Free Pantry, we can take our 'need to feed' to the Kennett community, encouraging neighbors to share food with neighbors."





In May of 2022, the Daly Family installed their third Free Little Pantry at the Avondale Garage Youth Center location. In partnership with Kennett Area Community Services (KACS), the FLP has distributed over 1,000 pounds of food each month to the Avondale community!

PAUL TICKLE

Paul Tickle, a long-time member of the West Grove - Avondale Rotary Club, had been a volunteer at The Garage Youth Center with his wife for many years. In the fall of 2021, when The Garage purchased our new Avondale location, Paul was one of the first in line to help with the renovations.

Since that first demolition day in October 2021, Paul has volunteered weekly to help with building maintenance and continued renovations. His greatest project and accomplishment during the fall and winter of 2022 was the near complete installation of the Avondale commercial kitchen space. Paul not only framed and hung the walls, he installed the cabinets, set the countertops, and essentially set up the entire kitchen. He worked tirelessly for months



to ensure the space was complete and compliant with all health department and building code standards. When the space was finished and inspected, the team lovingly began referring to the kitchen as "Paul's Mess Hall" — an apt nickname for his labor of love! We are so grateful to Paul for the time and talent he has generously shared with us!

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: THE PRODUCE PLACE

The Produce Place is a family owned and operated store which opened 15 years ago in July 2008. Here you can find a fresh array of fruits and vegetables for your daily/weekly grocery needs. You can also pick up freshly made salads, fruit cups and bowls, wraps, salsa, hummus, and more for lunch on-the-go.

According to our friends at the Produce Place, "The Biblical concept of helping those in need around us is the motivating factor in our support of non-profits. We believe that we have been blessed for the purpose of blessing others.

The people of Kennett Square have embraced us and have shown their overwhelming support of 'small business' and 'buying local'. Investing in this community is simply a natural way to convey our gratitude and give back to Kennett for their incredible support. We have truly enjoyed getting to know the people in this community and many of them we consider more than customers - they are friends!"



We are grateful for The Produce Place's generosity in providing delicious fruit as an after school snack, helping us to feed students as a part of our nutrition kitchen program. This wonderful company also provides the fruit trays for the Best Holiday Party in Town, our annual fundraiser in December. COMMUNITY SERVICE

One of The Garage's core values is to encourage students to reach their potential both as individuals and as members of their community. Within our Garage community, students learn relational skills like civility, respect, leadership, interdependence, responsibility, and community engagement. Students work with staff and volunteers on various projects throughout the community, such as sorting donated clothes at Wings for Success, teaching technology to seniors at the YMCA, and cleaning up our local parks. In addition, courts utilize The Garage as a place to send students who have been in trouble for minor offenses and need a place to work off their court costs.



PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Since the Covid-19 pandemic, The Garage staff have leaned into Parent Engagement as an essential piece of making our programs successful and improving the lives of the parents in our network. Each center now employs a Parent Coordinator who connects daily with program parents. Through monthly workshops and resource development, The Garage also provides connections to other non-profits and services to improve the lives of our students and families. Garage staff serve as a bridge for parents with the local school district by helping parents navigate and engage with the school education system.

ESL CLASSES

Utilizing volunteers from the community, The Garage team in Avondale is able to provide weekly evening ESL classes for our parents and alumni, as well as other community members in the Avondale area. Many Garage families speak little to no English, thus overlooking most of the resources, information, and opportunities available to them. By offering this program in an accessible and trusted space, The Garage can assist adult community members in learning English while encouraging them to maintain their native Spanish language.



BOYS & GIRLS PROGRAMS

Our enrichment programs fuse tutoring, mentoring, and service in order to holistically support our students. Our bi-monthly Girls and Boys Programs empower middle and high school students to make positive life decisions by exploring topics including healthy relationships, self-esteem, health/nutrition, and gender expectations, as well as by participating in career workshops, mock interviews, and leadership conferences.

ADVOCACY

AVONDALE FLOOD SURVEY

In 2022, the Wild and Scenic Program partnered with community leaders in Avondale Borough to engage residents impacted by recurring flooding. This was part of an effort to inform a Greening Plan with funding support from the National Park Foundation. The borough, which sits at the confluence of the upper branches of White Clay Creek, is subject to frequent flooding and has had two emergency evacuations in the past two years. The focus of this effort was engaging community members, largely Hispanic, in identifying solutions to mitigate the impacts of flooding while also addressing other needs related to parks, open space, safety, and affordable housing.

Utilizing River Network's Community-Led Research Toolkit, the team met biweekly to develop an outreach plan, which included surveying the community about their needs and priorities so these could be incorporated into the plan. Students who attend The Garage assisted with administering this survey to residents. Data were collected from 104 respondents, then analyzed to determine what the community's key messages were.



Demographic information helped us see that flooding impacts are not equally distributed — they impact the most vulnerable more heavily. Moreover, the Spanish-speaking population reported more home evacuations, negative impacts on their finances, and vehicular damage They also noted more impacts on their mental health due to frequent flooding than English-speaking residents did.

Additionally, the survey results indicated a need for attainable housing, preferably within a 5-mile radius of Avondale Borough, and the desire for a more walkable community with safer crosswalks, more community gardening space, more shade trees, and more green spaces.

While much of the information gleaned from the survey will be incorporated into the greening plan, additional information about housing needs and public safety learned outside this project's scope is being shared with organizations, agencies, and elected officials who can better address these issues. It's an exciting opportunity for The Garage to help our students understand how their voices are vital to our community



and essential for the improvement of the social issues that directly relate to our lives. We are grateful for our inclusion in this community-led advocacy effort.

COMFORT CARE SHELTER

This past year, State Representative Christina Sappey supported The Garage's efforts to secure our Avondale location as a comfort center with an award of \$23,000 in state funding. The grant was used to help purchase and install an emergency generator and shower, as well as to provide basic shelter essentials for small children, including meals. The team at the Avondale Garage was recently trained by the Red Cross as an emergency storm shelter location. This means that in the event of a flood or other extreme weather event, we can temporarily shelter up to 100 individuals.

"I am pleased to see this investment in the Garage Community and Youth Center," says Sappey, D-Chester. "The center helps families in the community by providing a safe, supportive place for youth after school. Portions of Avondale have a history of flooding during storms, so I am grateful to the Garage for working proactively to assist impacted families. This has been a serious concern for the community for some time, and anything to improve safety for our families is important to invest in."

The grant funding was provided through the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services.



SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL

BODY SHOP

The Garage Body Shop provides a safe environment for students to pursue their physical fitness goals and build their confidence. It started off small, with only a few sets of dumbbells, and quickly grew into a respectable gym where anyone can pursue their weightlifting goals. After our regular after school program ends, we open our gym to the students and invite volunteers to help mentor and coach

them. Not only can the students lift weights in community with one another, they are also able to connect and form intergenerational relationships with the volunteers who come. The Garage Body Shop is about more than just lifting weights, it is about instilling our students with values such as confidence, perseverance, and the satisfaction of working hard to achieve their goals.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT: AVIREY VILLACANA

The Body Shop is much more than just a place where students can lift heavy weights and pursue their physical fitness goals. It is a place where students can challenge themselves, learn how to overcome difficult obstacles, grow through failure, and build their confidence levels. It isn't just a place where their bodies are changed, but where their mental and emotional health changes as well. One student who has embodied this is eighth grader Avirey Villacana.



Avirey has grown leaps and bounds the last two years we have known him. He became involved with both the Body Shop program and the counseling sessions offered in partnership with New London Counseling Center. These two programs combined have helped Avirey grow in his physical, mental, and emotional health. He is more confident in himself and more outgoing, not to mention much stronger! It has been great to see Avirey embody what the Garage Body Shop is all about.

SELF CARE

The Garage recognizes that health is more than physical upkeep, but mental and emotional as well. The mental health effects of COVID-19 have been felt both locally and universally by many. The Garage combats this trend with virtual and in-person Self Care programming. Our Self Care programs take place twice a month and provide students with the rapeutic tools to navigate complex emotions and feelings and form practical healthy relationship skills with themselves and others. In addition, The Garage has partnered with New London Counseling Center to provide more structured mental health programs, including having an onsite therapist who provides individual therapy sessions for students once a week at both centers.





HARM-REDUCTION CURRICULUM

The Garage received a 2-year grant through the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board to provide the research-based Botvin Harm-Reduction program as part of our Out of School time programming. The program's goals include building effective defenses against pressures to use tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs, all while enhancing self-esteem, developing problemsolving abilities, reducing stress and anxiety, and managing anger for better mental health. Botvin Curriculum is recognized as a Model Program by the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention, The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, and the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy.

OLWEUS: ANTI-BULLYING

The Garage received continued support via a grant renewal of the research-based anti-bullying Olweus program. Developed at Clemson University and monitored through Penn State University, the program's goals are to reduce and prevent bullying problems among school children and to improve peer relations. Olweus has been found to reduce bullying among students, improve the social climate of classrooms, and reduce related antisocial behaviors such as vandalism and truancy. This project is funded by the PA Department of Health and Human Services, and The Garage is one of only six grantees in the state of Pennsylvania.



VOCATIONAL

MAPS

The MAPS (Motivating, Advancing, Powerful Students) is a program which focuses on advising and counseling students as they prepare for and transition to life after high school graduation. MAPS is run by our Graduate Coordinator who works with high school students at both the Kennett Square and Avondale centers. MAPS hosts weekly presentations for all students related to career interests and opportunities, post-secondary education and training programs, and personal aptitude and passion identification. MAPS also hosts weekly gatherings of upperclassmen to focus on relevant transition topics and materials such as college applications and essays, scholarship information, FAFSA completion, resume writing, networking, etc. Additionally, MAPS hosts monthly college visits throughout the school year and summer, as well as a multicollege overnight opportunity during spring break. Our Graduate Coordinator also works one-on-one with high school juniors and seniors to guide them as they prepare for adulthood. Furthermore, our Graduate Coordinator maintains communication and follows up with Garage alumni to act as a continued resource and bridge for our newer graduates who continue to face immense challenges.



CAREER COMPASS

Career Compass is an 8-week, paid summer internship experience for Garage students. Participants are placed at professional businesses and organizations throughout the community that are directly related to their career interests and aspirations. For many of our students, their families depend on them for financial support during the summer; however, youth employment opportunities are scarce and most students feel limited in the types of jobs they can work. We want our students to know they have the option to access jobs that provide livable wages as well as new opportunities that will help build their resume, expand their skill sets, and grow their confidence. Without access to a youth workforce program like Career Compass, our students are at risk of not pursuing post-secondary education and failing to rise above the poverty they've grown up in.




STUDENT SPOTLIGHT:

Despite arriving in this country a few months ago, Lupita continues to impress all of us with how fast she is learning English as a second language. She is eager to learn more about the presentations given at the Garage by outside organizations and always asks good questions about the opportunities that are available to her. Lupita is always in search of the next challenge and pushes herself to perform better academically.

Lupita attends The Garage daily and encourages her friends to do the same. In her words, this has been her experience with The Garage so far: "I was hesitant to join [The Garage] at first, but once I did a lot of things happened. First of all, I socialized more with people I knew from school, which helped me a lot since I just moved to the country, so I didn't really know anyone. Surprisingly I became friends with some of them. The second thing is that I met new people from other schools; opening my perspective and flexibility when doing team activities and giving

me the opportunity to socialize even more. The Garage has helped me in ways I didn't imagine it to, not just in the social aspect, but the career aspect. While taking advantage of the given



FAMILY SERVICE OF **CHESTER COUNTY**

Family Service (FS) is a non-profit human services and counseling agency that has been serving Chester County since 1947. Their mission is to provide life-changing individual and family support by removing barriers and providing access to counseling, case management, youth services, and family programs. They believe that every person has a right to safety, stability, and full integration into their community.

Family Service of Chester County is dedicated to providing the most effective and compassionate services to help their clients reach their potential. Their diverse program lineup and service offerings provide a continuum of care to support individuals and families from all walks of life, using both education and empowerment to foster whole person and whole family wellbeing. These programs include general counseling, Project ONE, Exchange Club Family Center, Supportive Housing, Volunteer Assisted Rides, Familias Unidas, Strengthening Steps, The Strengthening Families Program: For Parents and Youth 10-14, and Familias Fuertes.

Familias Fuertes was a program offered by Family Service in collaboration with The Migrant Education Program and The Garage Youth Community and Youth Center. Parenting youth is a challenging job, and parenting in a multicultural world can be even more challenging — especially when Hispanic children acculturate faster than their parents. Familias Fuertes supports parents in establishing expectations for their youth, and then guides them in the process of learning the skills necessary to communicate these family values effectively. This creates a united family unit that is led by parents who demonstrate both love and limits to their children.

This past year, The Garage hosted Family Service of Chester County's Familias Fuertes Program at our Avondale campus. During the six-week program, 36 youth, caregivers and extended



family learned communication skills as well as ways to increase family bonding and peer pressure refusal techniques — all while having lots of family fun! The families started their evenings over a shared family meal, underscoring the importance of this family bonding time, followed by participation in engaging and informative evidence-based activities. Not only did this weekly commitment allow family members to share dedicated time with one another, it also gave these recently immigrated families an opportunity to make new friends and establish a new sense of community in Southern Chester County.

In our partner's words: "Family Service is grateful to have worked with these wonderful families, along with the support of Migrant Education and The Garage, in such a warm and supportive environment."







Finally, at the end of the school year, we ask for feedback on essential elements of our organization, including relationships with our staff, peers, and overall experience. We are proud to share the results.


